What we offer....

- 1. Frontier Girls actively encourages patriotism in our members. We strongly support both our veterans and military personnel. Girls of military families wear special ribbons and pins to show others that they are making sacrifices for the freedoms the rest of us enjoy.
- 2. Our Support a Soldier Program pairs
 Frontier Girls troops with soldiers serving
 overseas. The girls make cards and put
 together care packages to send to their
 soldier on a monthly basis. Members of
 your organization can work with the girls to
 gather supplies and ship packages.
- 3. Owning a Frontier Girls troop gives your organization the opportunity to have an impact on youth in your community and to promote patriotism and respect for our military. When your troop appears in public it helps make the community realize that veterans organizations not only support veterans, but help teach youth about important American principles as well.
- 4. Owning a Frontier Girls Troop can give your organization added exposure in the community. Frontier Girls troops participate in local parades and festivals in addition to participating in community service projects. Your organization has the opportunity to steer the girls into projects that further your organization's goals in the community.
- 5. Frontier Girls are encouraged to form a local Flag Corp to perform formal flag ceremonies for community events such as parades, 4th of July events, and Memorial Day services. Veterans organizations are the perfect partners to make sure that these ceremonies are done according to code. Your group can also work with your troop to arrange community flag retirement ceremonies.

What we are seeking....

- 1. A Charter Organization willing to run our troop as part of their youth programming under their non-profit status. Unlike other scouting programs, Frontier Girls LLC is not a 501(c)3 and simply sells program curriculum and a license to use their name and uniform to existing non-profits to use as part of their own youth programming.
- 2. The Chartered Organization shall provide adequate meeting facilities. Most Charter Organizations allow troops to meet on their own premises, but if the facilities are not appropriate to Frontier Girls meetings, they can arrange for an offsite meeting place.
- 3. The Charter Organization will appoint a Troop Leader who will be responsible for running the Frontier Girls troop and will be the main contact for all communication with Frontier Girls LLC. The Troop Leader will be accountable for following the terms and conditions of Frontier Girls LLC as well as all policies and procedures set forth by the Charter Organization.
- 4. The Charter Organization must approve all volunteers and verify that personal references and any previous experience working with youth in other organizations have been checked.

5. The Chartered Organization shall include Frontier Girls programming as part of its overall program for youth and families. This includes covering the activities of the troop with general liability insurance to cover the girls and volunteers. The Charter Organization shall reserve the right to restrict the activities of their troop based on their own policies and procedures.
